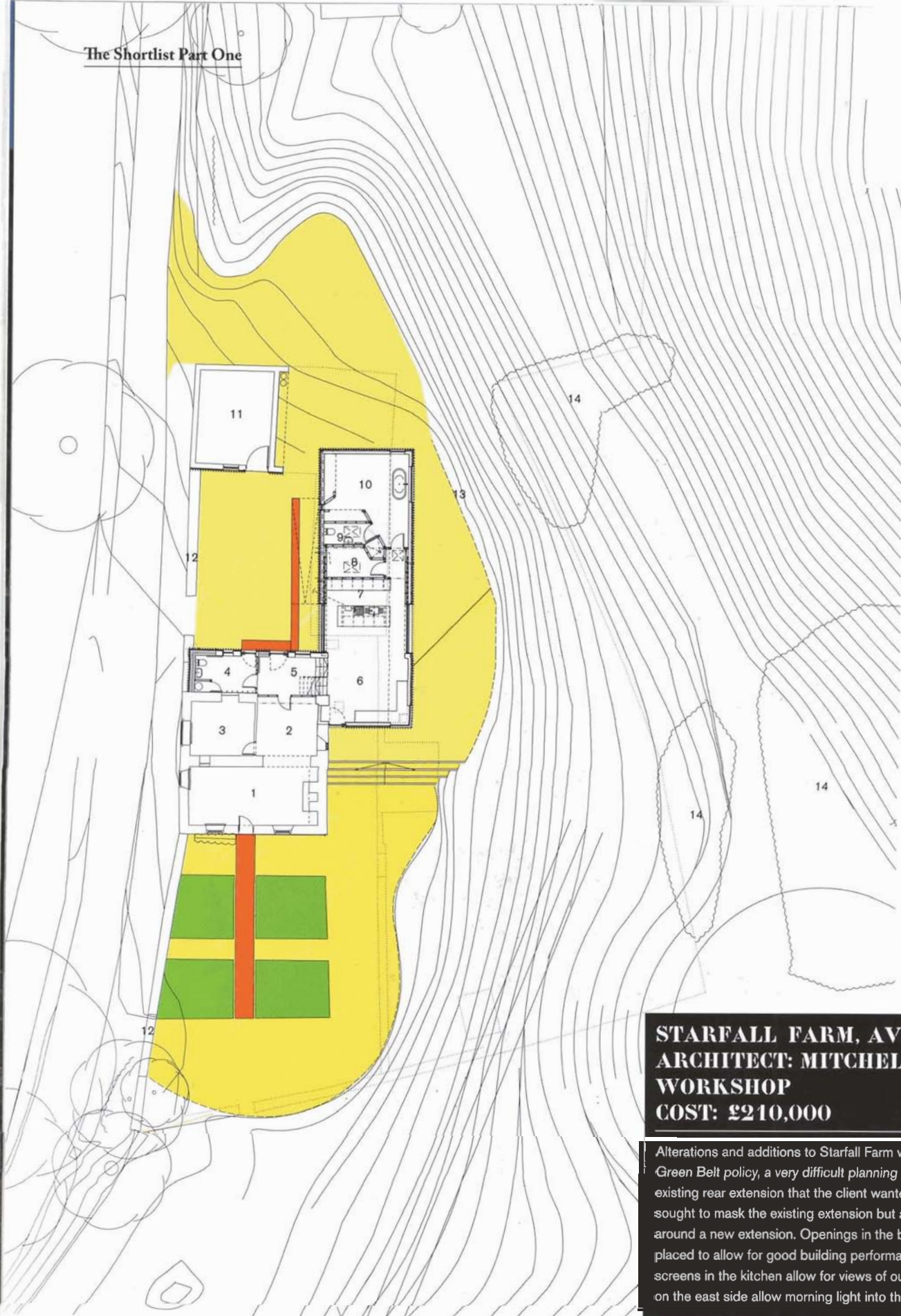

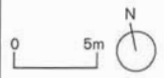

Site plan

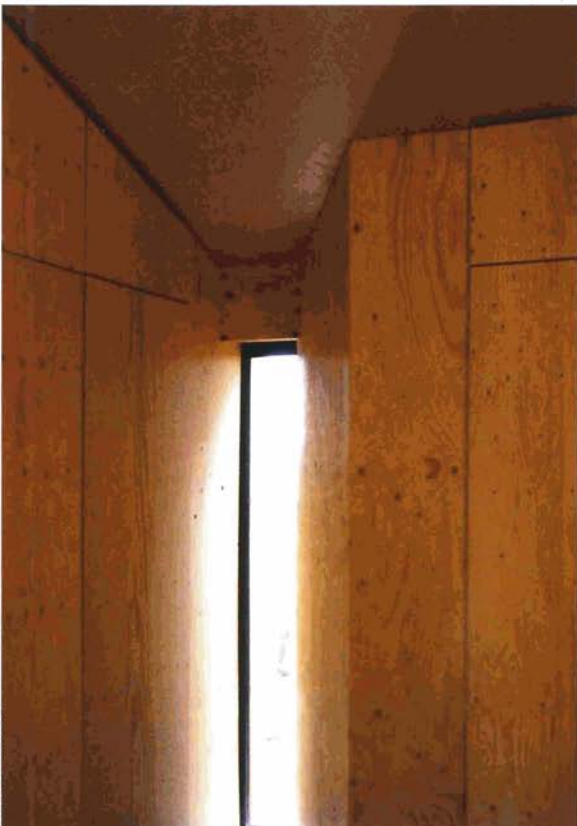

STARFALL FARM, AVON
ARCHITECT: MITCHELL TAYLOR WORKSHOP
COST: £210,000

Alterations and additions to Starfall Farm were constrained by Green Belt policy, a very difficult planning committee and an existing rear extension that the client wanted to retain. MTW sought to mask the existing extension but also wrap seamlessly around a new extension. Openings in the building were carefully placed to allow for good building performance; sliding glass screens in the kitchen allow for views of outside and rooflights on the east side allow morning light into the heart of the building.
